The pandemic halted this progression for the next year throughout 2020.





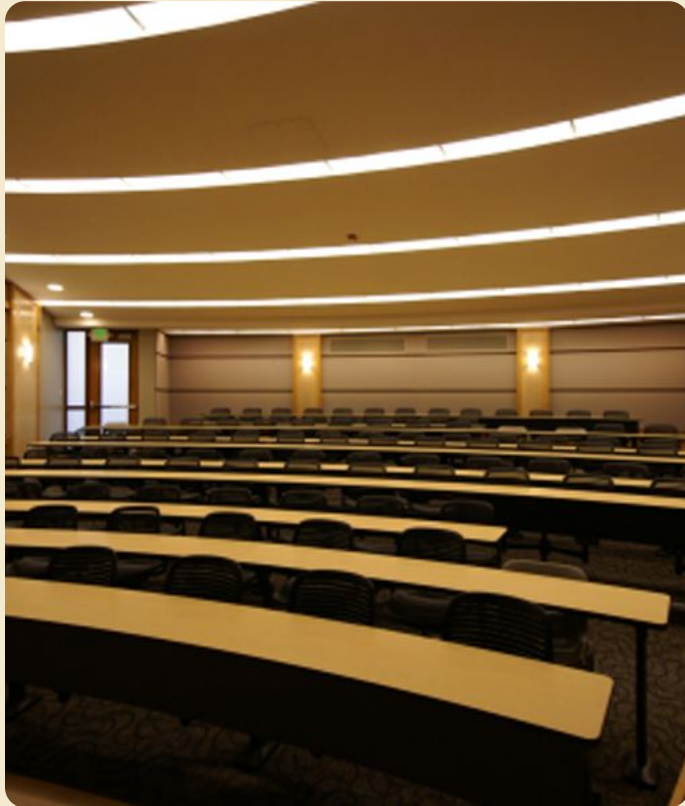
